As we are getting closer to the end of the year, I am concerned that students are becoming less focused on following the school rules and treating others with the respect that they deserve. As such, I set down a zero tolerance policy whereby if any student in Years 3-6 throws a punch (for any reason) they will be issued with an immediate warning of suspension. A second incident will result in immediate suspension. I'm sure we will not have to go down this path, but if we do, at least students (and families) are aware that I am serious about our rules and the safety of ALL students.


